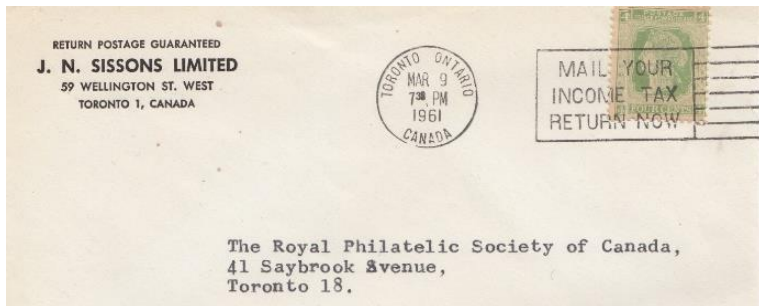
Two Canadian Covers franked with

Before Canadian confederation, the colonies of British Columbia and Vancouver Island, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Newfoundland issued stamps in their own names. The stamps issued are still valid for franking letters mailed in Canada.

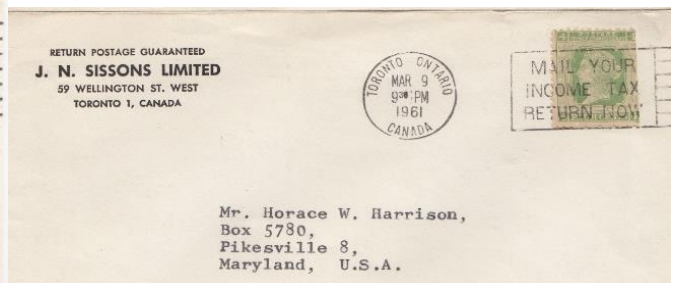
Cover # 1



Is this the 4 cent rate correct for cover # 1 ?

Yes the "Drop Letter" rate for mail was 4 cents

Cover # 2



Is the rate of 4 cents correct for cover # 2 ?

*No the rate for mail to the USA was 5 cents
Postage Due of 2 cents was not assessed*
