They were all active members of the club at one time or another. Jim has donated his entire stamp collection to the club, with half of the proceeds going to the club and the other half to cancer research.

To recognize this generous gift and to honor their memory, we are dedicating the next auction to Fred, Dave and Jim. We have selected 100 items from Jim's Canadian collection to kick off the auction on June 28. The entire proceeds of these lots will go to the cancer fundraiser. Jim was a meticulous collector and had many older plate blocks. There is also a nice selection of Back of Book items, many MNH and some high value and hard to find items. Some high value stamps will even be sold by Dutch Auction to guarantee a sizable donation. It's time for you to fill some gaps and upgrade.

Jim had an almost complete MNH Canadian Collection up to 2012 and quite a nice collection of MNH US stamps as well so look for some high quality Canadian and US items in future auctions.

Tineke reports that she enjoyed the show but would have liked it more if different countries had tables, as in 1996. Not just dealers. Canada Post did not have mailboxes to mail things in. You had to go outside, if you wanted to do that, and run the risk that the show stamps and cancellations would be covered with another cancellation. The entries were in 2 rooms, far from each other, which was a bit confusing. You needed the program to find the ones you really wanted to see especially in room B.

George Pepall comment that there were lots of volunteers, promoters and enthusiasm were evident at Society tables. The RPSC table became a meeting place, a depository for coats, purchases and supplies, a message relay station and a collector's focal point. George also noted the stunning quality of the one-frame exhibits.



The CAPEX 22 medal celebrates the proud history of CAPEX exhibitions, utilizing the same CAPEX symbol as used in all previous exhibitions since 1978. The primary medal colours and those of the medal case are the internationally recognized red and white colours of Canada’s flag. The medal design, technology and bold colour scheme is intended to attract new collectors to our hobby. Wording reflects Canada’s official bilingualism and speaks to our proud English and French heritage. Philatelists who have attended past CAPEX exhibitions speak fondly of their experiences. We trust that these medals will generate many CAPEX 22 memories for years to come.
