U.S. CIVIL WAR. Cover from captured Confederate officer held prisoner at Point Lookout, Maryland



This camp on a 40 acre sight was designed to hold 10,000 prisoners, but for most of the war held from 12,600 to 20,000, generally in tents.

The guards were mostly black troops. Opportunities for murder were sought by the guards who were known to have been offered as much as \$10.00 to \$15.00 apiece for every prisoner they could shoot in the discharge of their duty.


There was never enough food. Rats were a major source of protein for some prisoners.

Undated post mark at Point Lookout MD.

Return address from Captain William J Davis, Prisoner of War, Pt. Lookout Md, Ward 9, Bed 22.

Franked with U.S.A. 3 cent Scott #65.

Anglo Boer War. Mourning Cover sent to Boer prisoner held at Broad Bottom Camp in St. Helena.



The British sent their Boer War prisoners to distant British colonies, as they were concerned that there would be attacks to free them if held in South Africa.


Some 6,000 prisoners were sent to St Helena, and were held in tents at Dead Wood Plain, surrounded by barbed wire. Clashes between Transvaal prisoners and those from the Orange Free State, resulted in the latter being moved to a new camp at Broad Bottom.

Mourning Cover postmarked October 20, 1901 at Middleburg, Cape of Good Hope, posted to the Broad Bottom Camp, franked with Cape of Good Hope 1 penny (Scott #60).


Manuscript Notation "On Active Service, Stamps Unobtainable

Red Circular postmark reads London Paid 9 SP 01




Letter from His Royal Highness King George V to returning British Prisoners of War, 1918

attempts at various field post offices before return to sender.




An Illustrated Philatelic Glossary

"St. George" The Patron Saint of Scouting

The name of St. George is often used in a variety of ways. Here we see that the St. George Philatelic Society, has used a logo of St. George to represent their Stamp Club on a Souvenir Sheet that contains several Imperforate Cinderellas, and also as a Cachet on a Souvenir Cover.

Note that the cover is serviced with a Slogan Cancel that also uses the name of St. George.
