CANADA'S NATIONAL WAR MEMORIAL

CANADA'S NATIONAL WAR MEMORIAL MEASURES 200 FEET SQUARE AND IS 125 FEET IN HEIGHT. IT OCCUPIES THE CENTRAL POSITION ON VIMY RIDGE IN FRANCE.

This magnificent structure was designed by Mr. Walter S. Allward, Canadian Architect

AND SCULPTOR, IN 1921, UNDER WHOSE SUPERVISION THE ERECTION HAS BEEN COMPLETED.


HIS MAJESTY KING EDWARD VIII WILL UNVEIL THE MEMORIAL AT THE CEREMONY, WHICH WILL TAKE PLACE ON JULY 26TH, 1936, IN <mark>THE PRES</mark>ENCE OF 6,000 CANADIANS WHO WILL PARTICIPATE IN A SOLEMN PILGRIMAGE TO EUROPE TO PAY HOMAGE TO THOSE WHO MADE THE SUPREME SACRIFICE.

SYMBOLISM OF VIMY MEMORIAL

AT THE BASE OF THE STRONG, IMPREGNABLE WALLS OF DEFENCE ARE THE DEFENDERS, ONE GROUP SHOWING THE BREAKING OF THE SWORD, THE OTHER THE SYMPATHY OF THE CANADIANS FOR THE HELPLESS. ABOVE THESE ARE THE MOUTHS OF THE GUNS COVERED WITH OLIVE AND LAURELS. ON THE WALL STANDS AN HEROIC FIGURE OF CANADA BROODING OVER THE GRAVES OF HER VALIANT DEAD. BELOW IS SUGGESTED A GRAVE WITH A HELMET, LAURELS, ETC. BEHIND HER STAND PYLONS SYMBOL-IZING THE TWO FORCES CANADIAN AND FRENCH, WHILE BETWEEN AT THE BASE OF T<mark>HESE IS THE SPIR</mark>IT OF SACRIFICE WHO, GIVING ALL, THROWS THE TORCH TO HIS COMRADE. LOOKING UP THEY SEE THE FIGURES OF PEACE, JUSTICE, TRUTH AND KNOWLEDGE, ETC., FOR WHICH THEY FOUGHT, CHANTING THE HYMN OF PEACE. AROUND THE FIGURES ARE THE SHIELDS OF BRITAIN, CANADA AND FRANCE. ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE PYLONS IS THE CROSS.

ON THE WALLS ARE INSCRIBED THE NAMES OF 11,285 MISSING CANADIANS, THAT IS, THOSE KNOWN TO BE DEAD BUT HAVING NO KNOWN GRAVES.

COLOMBIA'S TORTUOUS TERRAIN

Three ranges of the Andes mountains run the length of Colombia and divide it into regions that differ widely in climate, population and characteristics in general.



These mountains were formidable obstacles to intercommunication and for generations they hampered the Country's commercial and industrial development.

From early days the link between the Caribbean Coast (Barranquilla) and the Capital city of Bogotá (deep in the interior), was the mighty Magdalena River.

Flat-bottomed stern-wheelers transported freight and mail 600 miles up the river; then it was portaged around the rapids to be re-loaded on




another river steamer for the balance of the journey to Girardot. From there it was transported overland to Bogotá (8,630 ft elevation).

Depending on the Season and the river water level, that journey could take anywhere between a week to a month.

Railways were built to connect various cities, but it was not until 1961 that a line linked the Capital to the Caribbean coast.





It can truly be said that Colombia jumped from the mule to the aeroplane for intercity contact.

Air routes were established before many of today's highways.


