An Illustrated Philatelic Glossary

“COIL STAMPS”

Stamps issued in rolls are usually called “coil Stamps” and can usually be identified by having perforations on 2 opposite sides and not on the other two sides.



In this case we see a coil pair issued by Sweden on 11 October 1975 to honour the 14th Scout World Jamboree. Since the 2 stamps have different designs this can be called a “Se tenant Coil Pair”



Some philatelists choose to collect single coil stamps such as this Canoe coil stamp issued by the U.S.A. 25 May 1991



Most collectors choose to collect coil stamps in pairs or strips of 3 or 4 stamps as in this example of the 1998 American Kestrel coil stamp

Some coil stamps are referred to as either “horizontal coils” or “vertical coils.



On “horizontal coils” the perforations are on the sides of the stamps



On “vertical coils” the perforations are on the top & bottom of the stamps

Note the difference on these two Canadian stamps
